## Diarrhoea and Vomiting

We have been advised by UKHSA (UK Health Security Agency) to inform you that we have several cases of Diarrhoea and vomiting (gastroenteritis) in school. If you think that your child may be have developed this infection, please keep them off school until they are 48-hour symptom free. Please inform school immediately of any cases.

#### What is it?

Scarlet Fever is an infection due to a germ called Streptococcus.

#### What are the symptoms

Scarlet Fever often starts with a sore throat, high fever, swollen neck glands and tonsillitis. A skin rash develops on the body, and the face if often flushed. The tongue may be smooth and bright red.

If you think that your child may have any of the above symptoms, please: Contact school

#### Free school meal eligibility

We have seen an unprecedented rise in FSM eligibility in schools across Sheffield. With this in mind we want to make sure that our parents are aware of how to check their eligibility.

Even if you don't think you are eligible, it is worth your while to check. In order to claim FSMs a parent/carer must be claiming one of the following benefits:

- Universal Credit (provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400, as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods)
- Income Support
- income based Jobseeker's Allowance
- income related Employment Support Allowance
- support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- the guaranteed element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit as long as you have a yearly household income of

less than £16,190 (as assessed by HM Revenue and Customs) and do not get Working Tax Credit

• Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit) Please see more information on the attached letter.
