In the Gospel last Sunday, we heard the story of the servants and the Talents. The children and I thought about this during our assembly on Monday. We discussed the gifts and talents that God has given us and how we need to make the most of these. We then focused on the talent we all share, the one we discuss each week, the one that allows us to be Jesus's presence for others: the ability to love. We thought about how we can share this most important talent through the way we treat others and how this talent, just like those from two of the Masters' servants, will double if others follow our example. The value of the Talents from Jesus's story was equal to around £500,000 each in today's money; what a rich school we would be if the talents our children share each day had a financial value! Well done and thank you children for making our school such a wonderful place so full of love.

This Sunday we celebrate the last Sunday of the Church's year, the feast of Christ the King. To mark this occasion, we are having a school family mass at Our Lady and St Thomas' Church at 9.15. I do hope you will be able to come along.


