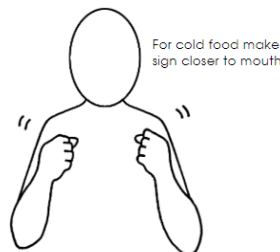

Free school meal eligibility

We have seen an unprecedented rise in FSM eligibility in schools across Sheffield. With this in mind we want to make sure that our parents are aware of how to check their eligibility.

Even if you don't think you are eligible, it is worth your while to check.

In order to claim FSMs a parent/carer must be claiming one of the following benefits:

- Universal Credit (provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400, as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods)
 - Income Support
 - income based Jobseeker's Allowance
 - income related Employment Support Allowance
 - support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
 - the guaranteed element of State Pension Credit
 - Child Tax Credit as long as you have a yearly household income of less than £16,190 (as assessed by HM Revenue and Customs) and do not get Working Tax Credit
 - Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)

Please can we remind you that we ask for only uniform donations, a few coats have been donated which we are grateful for, however our focus is pre-loved uniform. With this in mind, we have a selection of uniform and coats in the school office which has been organised and are free to take.
