Dear Lord,



Online gaming is very popular with children and adults alike and players can play live with people across the world through a range of devices. In-game chat is a feature that many parents worry about, and which can cause anxiety and danger to children.

It is always helpful to discuss with your child how to stay safe online. Set boundaries about what information they can and can't share and what to do if they come across something inappropriate such as bad language. They should know that they can come and talk to you if they feel others are being mean or making them feel uncomfortable online. Here are some useful resources about in-game chat and specific games.
