Arise, prayer-walk, and bring hope to your community this Spring.



*This March, Christians from across Sheffield will be using their daily walk to pray for the houses and streets they pass. The vision: to prayer-walk every street in Sheffield by Easter. Using the Arise app, believers can track their prayer walks, and street by street we'll see an interactive prayer map light up. Each prayer will add to the bigger picture of our love for this City and its people. **We may be isolated, but we can pray as one.***

Arise has three main elements:

Prayer - believers across the city joining in to prayer walk every street in Sheffield between 1-31 March.

Share - local churches are devising additional (Covid-safe) ways to share their faith in their communities.

Invite - Arise Sheffield is sending an Easter card to every home in Sheffield via Royal Mail. The card will go to over 220,000 homes. It will invite local people to connect with their local church and watch an online video about the Gospel message, and followers of Jesus in Sheffield.

Laetare Sunday

On this Sunday, the antiphon is taken from the book of the prophet Isaiah (66:10-11). Even as we observe our Lenten sacrifices, we rejoice in anticipation of the joy that will be ours at Easter.
