Dear Parents and Carers,

In the Gospel on Sunday, we heard the Parable of the Dishonest Steward who squandered his employer's property. This Gospel message, that we need to show that we look after the smaller things so that we can then be trusted with bigger and more important things, is reflected in our core values of Ready, Respectful and Safe. By understanding and living out these basic values, our children are showing that they understand the simple responsibilities that they have day-to-day for their own learning and safety and that of others. It is through doing this that the children are recognised and praised and will then be trusted with bigger (and sometimes coveted!) responsibilities such as being book, pencil or even skipping rope monitor, and then, in turn, develop the key values needed for adult life.

Today, was a special day as we have had our first school mass of the year. The children behaved beautifully, showing that they are ready, respectful and safe. Very well done children. I am so proud of you all.

The school planner will early next week. I am pleased to say that class assemblies will be returning this year. I have included the dates of the KS2 ones in the list of upcoming dates as these fall in this first half of the year.

We have our first parents' evenings soon too and I am sure you will hear lots of good things about how your children have settled in.

Thank you for the example of Queen Elizabeth II. You gave her a mission and she succeeded.


Please take care of Queen Elizabeth in heaven with her beloved husband, Prince Philip.
