Dear parents and carers,

Sunday's Gospel was one of my favourites as we heard the story of how Jesus calmed the storm. The Disciples, who were on a boat, became very scared by the ferocity of the storm and this fear was made worse for them because Jesus, the leader they looked to for support, was asleep on the boat and they felt alone. After waking and calming the storm, Jesus said to them, "Why are you fearful? Have you not faith yet?". In our assembly on Monday, the children and I thought about the relevance of Jesus's words and actions for us today. We thought about how there are times when we feel scared by 'storms' in our lives and how sometimes we might feel alone but that Jesus is always there for us to help us. We gave thanks for those people who Jesus has clearly entrusted to bring this reassurance to our daily lives: our friends, families; teachers / colleagues. We thought how reassuring it is to know that Jesus will always find a way to calm the storm.

It was lovely to see how many parents made it to our last open afternoon of the year this week. I hope you found the time informative and enjoyable. Next year, we plan to hold these in the Autumn and Summer terms; dates will be shared as soon as we have them.

This Tuesday, we have our whole school transition morning where the children will spend time with their new class teachers and visit their new classrooms for the first time. Our Y6 children are starting to take part in their transition visits to their new schools too. These can feel like 'stormy times' for all of our children but we know things will be ok as they are not alone.



# **A Safeguarding Policy Front Sheet**
