The NSPCC say that "Talking openly about life online from an early age, can be a helpful bridge to sharing safety messages and addressing more difficult conversations later; it also shows your child that you are someone who knows about the internet and can help them," so please ask your children about their learning from the day and look out for blog posts sharing our work.
