4 Feb	Luke 2:22-40	I'm Special! The Gospel this week shows the Presentation of Jesus at the temple. Jesus was expected long before he was born, just like us! 11 Feb	Luke 5:1-11	Will You Follow? The Gospel this week shows Simon, James and John giving up everything they had to follow Jesus. 11 March	Luke 4:1-13	I'm Tempted The Gospel reading this week shows the temptation of Jesus. 18 March	Luke 9:28-36	Transfigured In the Gospel this week we learn that Jesus' face shone - was transfigured - when he spent time with God. 25 March	Luke 13:1-9 / Psalm 102: 1-4, 6-8, 11	Show Some Mercy Through films of children enacting examples in day to day life, pupils will learn what is meant by mercy.
