Message From The Gospel

In the Gospel assembly on Monday 15th July we will be talking about being good samaritans.

'The Good Samaritan' is a story that has been taught to children for generations. Yet despite its familiarity to many, the parable still has a resonance that can impact how we view the world. In this assembly, we present a contemporary retelling of the story of 'The Good Samaritan' using a simple narrated drama. Children will consider who their neighbour really is and what it means to be a good one. The story asks some challenging questions: are we sometimes too busy to stop and help someone? Too embarrassed? Worried about how others might view us? Think it easier to walk away and do nothing? By the end of the assembly, children will be inspired to reach out to others in need over the holidays.
